# TECHNOLOGY AND STUDENT DEVICES

We recognize the value of technology and aim to provide meaningful learning opportunities whereby technology is a tool for students. At Isabelle Sellon School, we are also committed to providing learning environments that challenge our learners inquiry skills, problem solving skills and effective communication skills in the absence of various technologies.

Our goal is to reduce the overall amount of screen time for students during the school day. In an effort to do this, we expect all student cell phones and personal devices are kept in student lockers throughout the school day. Upon the direction of classroom teachers, students may use personal devices for academic tasks.

The best way to get hold of your child during the school day is via Amber at the school office. Each classroom also has a phone that students are able to use with teacher permission.



#### **SCHOOL SPORTS AND INTRAMURALS**

Current health and safety measures are in effect to allow student participation in school sports.

During the month of October and into early November, we will offer a Volleyball program for interested students during the school day (recess break) and after school (3:20-4:20).

To offer this programming safely, dates of participation will be by grade level cohort only. In the event that student participation numbers are too high, students will participate by classroom cohort to accommodate health guidelines of no more than 1/3 capacity in the gym.

If your child is interested in participating in the after school program, please complete the permission form that will be sent home during the week of Oct. 5-8th. No permission form is needed for intramurals.

# **SAFETY DRILLS**

Safety drills (fire drills, lockdown drills) are held regularly throughout the school year to ensure procedures are practiced and reinforced to maintain the safety of everyone. These safety drills may be announced or unannounced to students and staff.

During the month of October, a lockdown drill will occur. As this is our first lockdown drill of the school year, staff and students will be made aware.

Classroom teachers will be reviewing safety procedures with students to build understanding, awareness and preparedness.
