Academics: Student goal setting, scoreboards and success at ISS:

As a *Leader in Me* school, students are learning the 7 Habits of Highly Effective People and are applying these habits to guide their personal success and achievement. An overarching school wide target was set: All students will achieve growth in Literacy and Numeracy from September to January. In October, all students set personal goals to increase growth in literacy and numeracy; based on their September STAR results. Through the months of November, December and January, students tracked their minutes of focused literacy and numeracy tasks with the intent that increased time should have an impact on growth. STAR assessments were completed again in January. *So, how did we do overall*?

Overall Grade 6	LA- 5.2-5.5 GE- increase of 0.3 grade equivalency (3 months growth in 4 month period) Math- 4.3-4.9 GE- increase of 0.6 grade equivalency (6 months growth in 4 month period)
